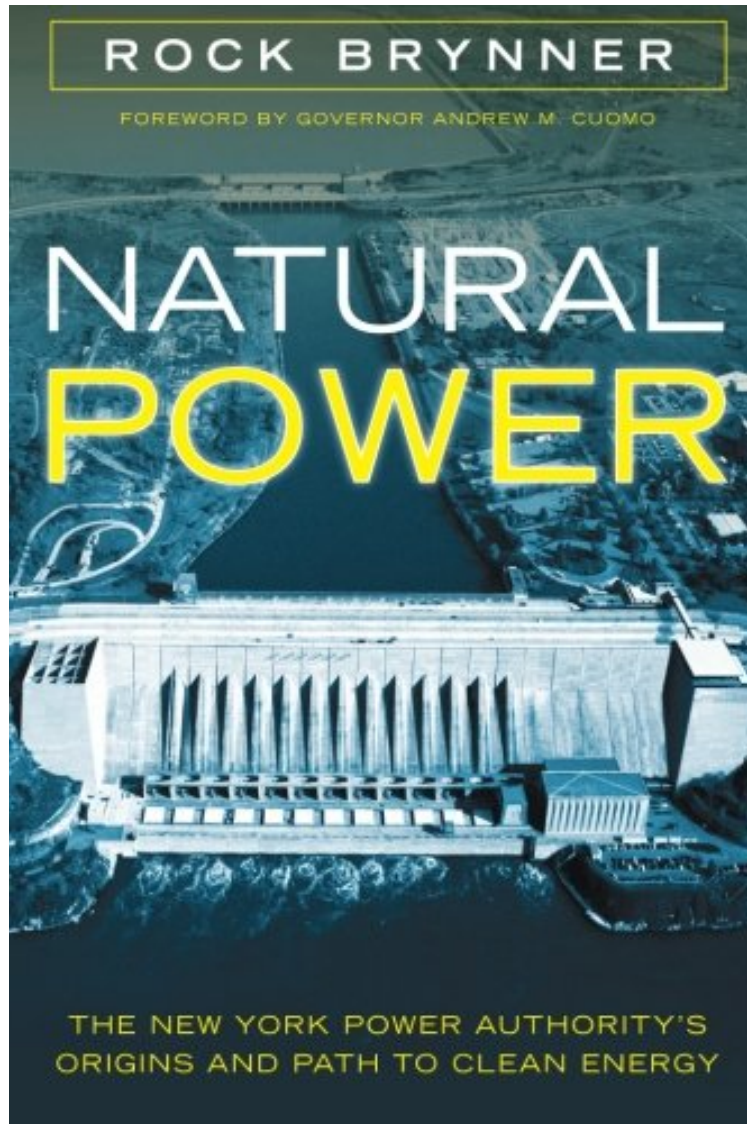

Anyone interested in where the states public resources came from, how inventors like Edison and Tesla fit into the picture, and the role of key figures such as Franklin D. Roosevelt, Dwight Eisenhower and master builder Robert Moses will appreciate Brynners work. Given that the New York Power Authority isnt a very well-known entity, this book also takes a good look at the utilitys role in generating clean hydropower and leading the development of an industry that launched technological change across the nation.

Today, this essential public service provides almost a quarter of New York State's power, dedicates much research and development to environmentally-friendly power sources, and consistently leads the vanguard of utilities in sustainability and modernization in the 21st century.
