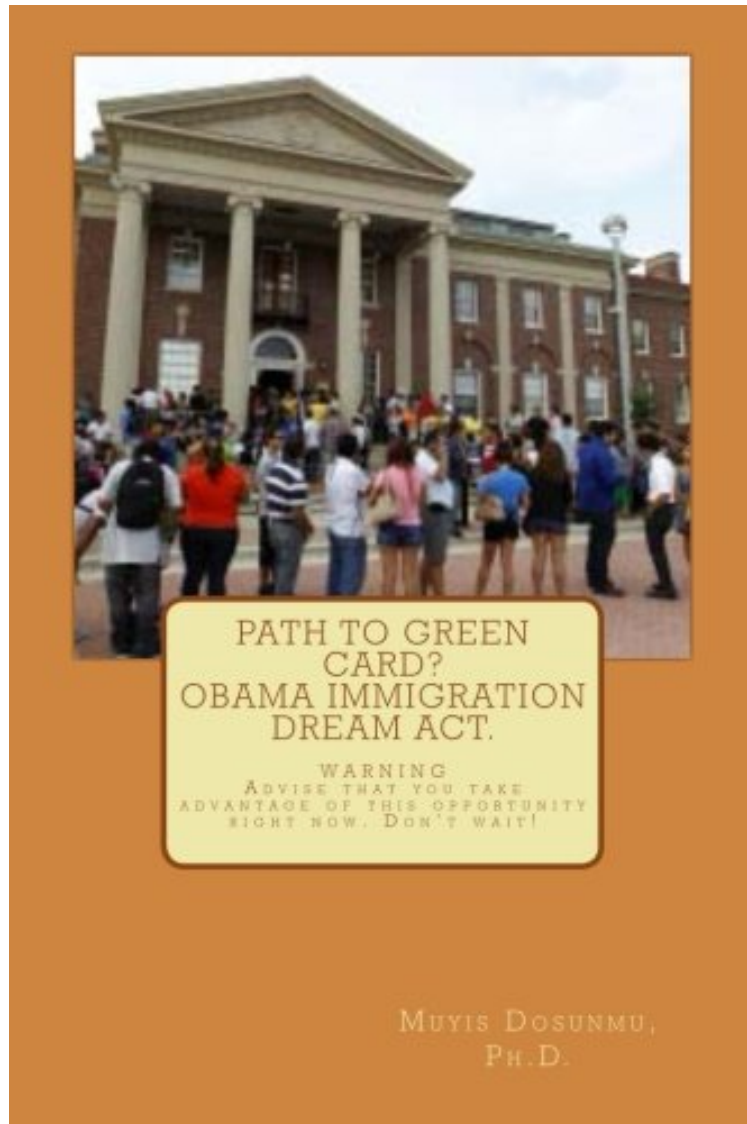

(e.g. on the first couple pages of the booklet, it states that in order to be eligible to apply for relief, undocumented students must be under 31 years of age and on page 4, it suddenly switches to 30 years of age. That's just poor fact checking and editing). All images in the booklet are pixilated and of poor quality. I was attempting to gather information for an academic project and I cannot use this booklet as a source as it contains contradictory information and is not well cited. Better texts for learning about DREAMers and/or The DREAM Act are Nicholls' "The DREAMers" (2013), Perez's "We Are Americans" (2009) or Chavez's "Shadowed Lives" (2013). For non-academic sources, Wikipedia has more information and is written better than this booklet.

**WARNING** Advise that you take advantage of this opportunity right now. Don't wait! Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals is a new directive introduced by the Obama Administration on June 15, 2012. The policy shift will allow individuals unlawfully brought into the U.S. as children, and who meet certain guidelines, to apply for two years of deferred action subject to renewal and termination at the discretion of the DHS. Who Is Eligible For Deferred Action? In order to be eligible for Deferred Action you must: Have entered the United States when you were younger than 16 years of age; Have been in the United States for five years prior to June 15, 2012 (small trips outside of the United States for humanitarian reasons won't impact this requirement); Be older than 15 to apply; Not be older than 30 years of age; Have either graduated from a high school or equivalent, enrolled in school or are a veteran of the United States military; Submit to a background check and have a clean record without felonies, misdemeanors (other than maybe one or two small misdemeanors), or any evidence of you being a threat to the country. What Are The Required Documents For Filing Deferred Action? When you file for Deferred Action you will need to provide documentation that proves that you qualify. To demonstrate that you came to the United States before you were 16, that you have lived in the United States for five years and that you were in the United States as of June 15th, 2012 you will need Financial records, Medical records, School records, Employment records or Military records. To show that you are in school, graduated, in the military or were honorably discharged you will need a Diploma, GED certificate, Report card, High-school transcript, Report of separation form, Military personnel record or Military health record.
