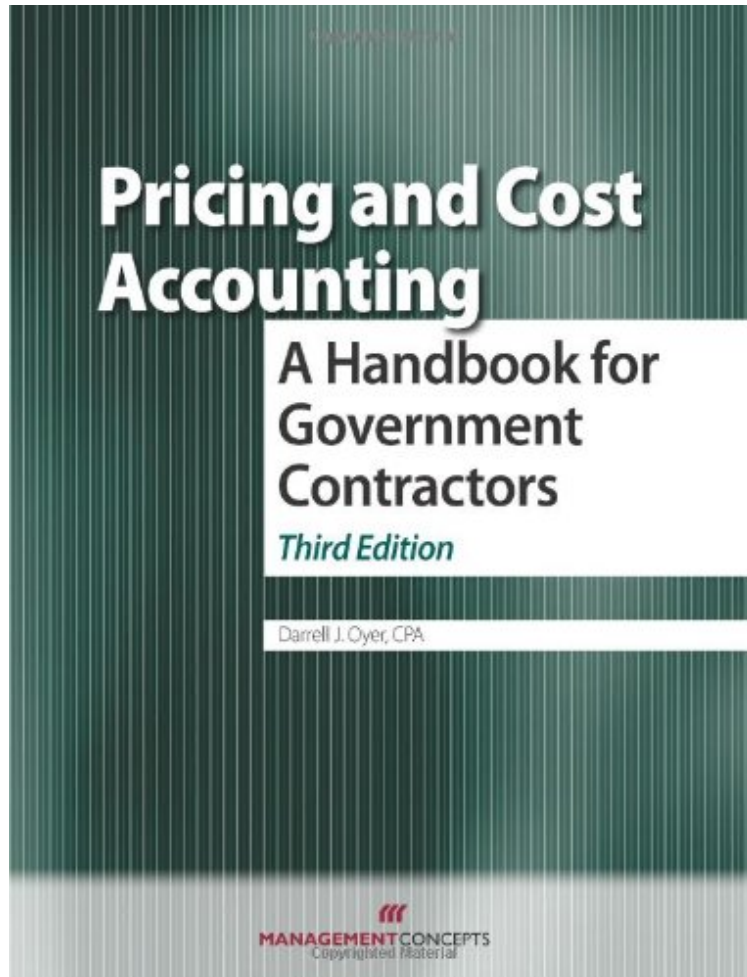

AnonI had to buy this for my Government Contracts Cost Pricing class. It's definitely not meant to law students or lawyers, as the title clearly indicates. So that wasn't a shock. There aren't many in text citations to the FAR or CAS, so that made it difficult to use to follow in class. But it provided a decent plain-language summary before delving into the FAR. For class, I would read the chapter on whatever topic we would discuss ahead of time, and that made reading the regulations a little easier. For a government contractor who needs to know the basics very quickly, I guess it would be a good place to start. But if you are a law student and need this for class, a *much* better source of information would be Karen Manos' treatise - available on Westlaw.
